This term's theme:

My place, My time



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As Historians this term:

We will be learning about Roman Britain. During the unit, we will discover how the Roman Army functioned as a tactical and successful unit. Also, we will learn about beliefs people held during the period of Roman rule. Throughout the unit, we focus on interpreting a range of primary and secondary sources, evaluating their usefulness and using them as clues to give us a better idea of life in the past.

As Athletes this term:

We will continue to develop our dance skills, focussing on techniques such as canon and unison to choreograph a Roman marching formation. Additionally, we will be developing our hockey skills, working on our striking and control, as well as the principles of attacking and defending.

As Scientists this term:

We will be studying living things and their habitats. We will leatn about life cycles of mammals, insects, amphibians and birds. Additionally, we will be learning about reproduction in some plants and animals.

As Artists this term:

The focus will be on developing our painting skills. During the unit, we will be improving our technique and control. Henri Rousseau will be our key artist for the unit, and, ultimately, we will be producing a painting in the style of Rousseau.

As Mathematicians this term:

We will be focussing on our calculation skills – practising mental methods and formal written methods for addition, subtraction, multiplication and division, before beginning to develop our understanding of fractions.

As Writers this term:

We are writing a narrative based on the story of Mai-Ling who is a dragon slayer. The focus is on developing speech and how this can support with characterisation.

As Readers this term:

We will continue to read Brace Mouth False Teeth as our 'reading for pleasure book'. To develop our reading skills in lessons, we will continue using expert tips on a variety of texts.
