As Communicators this term...

**We will develop our vocabulary through learning to talk about:**

- Autumn and the season changes
- Woodland animals and animal habitats
- Celebrations

**And by...**

- Using our words to make choices and share our ideas

**We will also...**

- Learn how to listen appropriately to adults and our peers



As Mathematicians, this term we will...

- Develop the method of touch counting (counting with 1:1 correspondence)
- Explore shapes, circles, triangles and shapes with 4 sides
- Talk about our learning using mathematical vocabulary
- Count on and back to five, using counting songs



To develop our physical skills this term, we will...

- Practise changing independently for PE and Forest School
- Develop our fine motor skills through challenges and activities such as weaving, threading, Dough Disco etc.
- Develop our pencil/pincer grip when holding a pencil
- Practise letter shapes and letter formation
- Identify and practise different ways of moving around a large space safely

As Artists this term, we will...

- Explore the work of Jackson Pollock
- We will make Bonfire pictures
- Practise mixing colours, using a range of objects other than a paintbrush to mark make
- Use thick and thin lines and splats to make large scale paintings inspired by Jackson Pollock
- Develop our use of the space (in the classroom) and resources safely e.g. pencils, pens, paint brushes, scissors etc.



As Readers and Writers this term, we will...

- Learn to recognise Set 1 Read Write inc sounds
- Learn how to blend sounds together to read simple words
- Learn letter formation rhymes to support us with forming letters correctly
- Learn to write our names
- Become storytellers using storymaps and props to support us

To help us understand the world around us this term, we will...

- Use the role play areas to act out our own experiences.
- Engage in multisensory activities to help us experience the season change
- Enjoy forest school and the outdoor area when exploring the weather and changes in Autumn

To develop our personal and emotional skills this term, we will...

- Play turn taking games
- Play imaginatively both indoors and outdoors with our friends.
- Identify and label different emotions
- Explore strategies to support us with our emotions
