Dogs on site

Recently, a number of dogs have been being brought on to school grounds before and at the end of the day. Although these dogs have been on leads and well behaved, we do not allow dogs on site (even carried).

This is for several reasons:

- Our school site is very busy. Dogs are an additional pressure on space.
- Not all children (or adults) like dogs. It doesn't matter how well behaved a dog is, if you are scared of them. We want children to feel comfortable arriving and leaving school.
- Dogs can be unpredictable.
- Dogs can make a mess. We have no reason to think any of the dogs brought in to school have fouled here, but there is always the possibility.
- Some children have severe allergies to dogs.

Ideally leave dogs at home. If you must bring them, then please tie them somewhere away from school, avoiding the pavement just outside, which is very narrow. Thank-you
