Overall, better attendance this week than last. However, we thought it might be helpful to give some numbers to those percentages. Why is there such a difference between one year group and the others? We haven't reported class figures to safeguard anonymity.

Reception: attendance was unusually low this week. This year group have been some of our best attenders this year. However, this week **9 children missed 19 school days between them.**

Year 1: 9 children had time off with 16 days between them

Year 2: 11 children had time off; 20 days in total. Did you know that if your child is very late to school, it counts as a half day absence?

Year 3: Very good attendance this week. Only 4 children missed time at school with 5 days between them

Year 4: Just below the minimum 95% expected 5 children missed 11 days between them

Year 5: 36 of the cohort were at Llanrug – that has helped attendance rates. Of the 17 children in Worcester, 3 had time off school with 5.5 days between them. One child in this cohort has left our school but must stay on our register as he hasn't got a place at a new school yet. This counts as an absence for the year group unfortunately. Without that child, attendance would be around 97%

Year 6:. 10 children had time off, 14.5 days between them
