REMEMBER ALL MEALS NEED TO BE CHOSEN, VIA SQUID, WHETHER YOU PAY FOR THEM OR NOT.




Swimming

After School Clubs

As you will know, school staff regularly volunteer to provide free after-school clubs to children each week. Last term, 15 clubs were run across 3 days each week, providing opportunities for 220 children!

Clubs will start again this term but not until after February half-term. There is limited opportunity due to lack of space to run clubs in the worst winter months because of the weather and poor light outside. Staff will instead be taking part in extra professional development which will further improve provision for all children at our school.

We hope you are understanding of this decision. Little Pears, our wrap-around after school care will continue as usual.

Start of the school day

All families received a paper letter before the Christmas holidays explaining changes to the beginning of the school day.

This change will start tomorrow, Monday 6th January.

All children from Year 1 – Year 6 will enter school through the Fire Exit door by the bottom of the car park and shelter (like a wet day.) The door will be opened at 8.35am. From there, children will go straight in to their classroom. Children in Reception, will go around the back of school as usual to enter their classroom.

Nursery times have not changed.

We have chosen to trial this "soft start" until February half-term and will seek your views towards the end of the trial. Thank-you
