- Set filters so that inappropriate material is blocked
- Keep phones, tablets etc. out of bedrooms

Well done Year 2 – the only ones above 95% and your highest attending week since early December.

Teachers will be able to let you know your child's current attendance rate at meetings this week. **Anything above 96% is considered good attendance.** 

Anything below 90% is considered persistent absenteeism and is likely to be having a negative impact on a child's progress in school. Remember fines may be issued where a child has 10 or more unauthorsied missed sessions (half day = 1 session) in a 10 week rolling programme.

#### **Half-term Food vouchers**
