Food Recycling

From Monday 31st March all businesses have a legal duty to separate food waste from general waste.

As you can imagine, this will involve a lot of education and support for our children.

We are putting the following measures in place:

- 1) A separate bin will be used in the dining hall for food waste.
- 2) Children who have a packed lunch will be told to take ALL waste home. We will reconsider this once school dinner children are used to the new system.
- 3) A member of staff will support children to put their waste into the correct bin.
- 4) Small food bins/boxes will be available to children in the classroom for fruit peel/ cores etc. at snack time.

Staff will also be required to follow the same rules.

We will be talking to all children about this new rule and why it is important for improving the environment. We would be grateful if you could support this by talking about the message at home too.

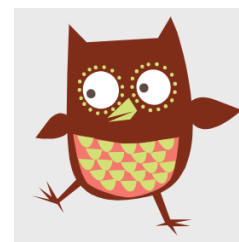
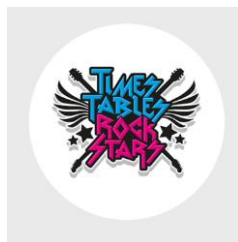
